Crystal (2008:199) states that the term generative is introduced by Noam Chomsky in his book "Syntactic Structures" (1957) to denote "the capacity of a grammar to define the set of grammatical sentences in a language" Crystal (ibid) mentions that "there are two main branches of generative linguistics: generative phonology and generative syntax"

GENERATIVE PHONOLOGY THEORY Generative phonology theory is a component of generative grammar that assigns the correct phonetic representations to utterances in such a way as to reflect a native speaker’s internalized grammar Noam Chomsky and Morris Halle founded the Generative School of Phonology in the late 1950s Its basic premises are that
